

Roxann and I watched the last round of the Master's Tournament; and it was wonderful. I remembered the times I have walked the course and watched up close and personal. There is an energy and excitement, and I love the experience. When I watched Scottie Scheffler sink the last putt to win the tournament, I was moved. This young man, 27 years old, won the Master's for the second time. He appeared to be excited and humbled. He could not wait to get back to Texas to be with his wife and share in the birth of their first child, due at any time. In reading about him, I was impressed with his faith and the influence of that faith in his life. Evidently, golf is important; but faith is vital. I thought about our local Master's winner, Larry Mize, whose faith and spirit have blessed and inspired me. It is encouraging to see good people finish first and know the source of their blessings.

As I watched Scheffler don the famed Green Jacket, I thought of all that came with it: the enhanced influence of his life; the opportunities that lay ahead; the young people who would look up to him and see him as a role model; and the way he could affect lives with his attitude and spirit.
